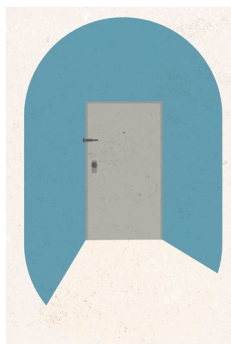
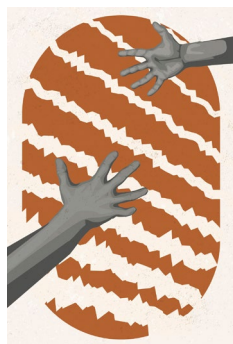
How will these National Days be different this year, with many hostages still in captivity?

LET'S EXPLORE

Moments in time are fleeting and our memories of them are often hazy. Images, in the form of drawings, photographs, or other artwork, can help us capture (and later evoke) the emotions of an experience indefinitely.

Use this collection of images and prompts to support you and your students as you try to make sense of your recent experiences around Israel and the hostages.

- Select a particular image that speaks to you: What do you notice about the image and the story that it is telling?
- Try to organize the images into themes.
- Assign a value to an image and post a question that speaks to the value.
- Give an image a title.
- Choose an image and share a story that you know or heard that relates to the image.

This year, in anticipation of the "Yamim" in a post October 7th world, the M² team commissioned designer Eli Kaplan Wildmann to create evocative artwork which can be used as a facilitation tool to engage learners in the experiences and feelings they have encountered during the past months.
